



Meghan Trainor cleared to sing

Meghan Trainor has been cleared to sing again following a haemorrhage on her vocal chords. The 'Dear Future Husband' hitmaker had been forced to cancel a number of shows in an attempt to recover and has revealed on Instagram that she is all better now. She wrote: "Great news!!! DOCTOR SAYS IM OK TO SING!! so happy!! Riding around the house on my new #Mohawk thanks to @onpointworld #goodday snapchat is Mtrainor22 (sic)". Meanwhile, Meghan previously revealed the painful issue was "killing her" as she'd never missed a tour date before. She said: "I don't want anyone worrying

but I have had a haemorrhage on my vocal cords. Right now the doctors want me on complete vocal rest until they are healed so I have to postpone my first two shows in Atlantic City and Connecticut. I promise that I will make it up to my Megatronz. "I have never missed a tour date before so this is killing me. I love you all very much and want to get healed quickly so I can show you this amazing tour we've been working on. I am truly sorry to everyone who has bought tickets and made travel plans. I hate this. (sic)"

Ryan Reynolds 'wept' at costume success

Ryan Reynolds "wept" when he saw his 'Deadpool' suit for the first time. The 38-year-old star has admitted it was hard work to create the tight-fitting garment in the time restraints but insists he is incredibly proud of the final result. He said: "Boy, we had to fight to get the suit to where it is now. There was a lot of work with very little time. Fox gave us the green light and we had to be on camera in 12 weeks. That's no time for prep. "So we kept fighting and fighting to make tweaks to the suit. Like when the deadline has passed and we were still going back and forth." Ryan added to ComicBook.com: "When we finally saw that suit, fully done, finished and completed ... both [director] Tim Miller and I wept. "I'm not even exaggerating: We

wept in Simi Valley, California, in some warehouse where some guy makes all these crazy suits and had this one under a spotlight. We walked in and we wept. Tears coming down our cheeks. It felt so good." Meanwhile, Ryan previously revealed it took him 45 minutes to get the superhero suit on at first. He shared: "It wasn't easy [to put on]. When it started it would take up to 45 minutes but in the end I had that thing down to 10 minutes. "I'm really just wearing like a unitard. Nothing too romantic I'm afraid. But that thing is hot, man. That thing is tight."



Diplo: Justin Bieber is a 'jerk'

Diplo thinks Justin Bieber is a "jerk". The pair recently collaborated on hit single 'Where Are ? Now' and while they got on well in the studio he admitted he doesn't think the 21-year-old star is always the nicest of characters. He explained: "Bieber's personal life is whatever it is-he's a rich kid and he's pretty much gonna have to be a jerk. But he's respectful to me, and he has that weird gene where he's good at everything: better at basketball than me, better at drums. For us it's more like an art project where you utilize his voice." Although the 36-year-old producer and DJ made a mainstream song with the 'Boyfriend' hitmaker, he went on to reveal he has been working on a more rockier sound recently with Vampire

Weekend frontman Ezra Koenig and has been "harassing Haim" because he's so keen to collaborate with them. He told Rolling Stone magazine: "I've done a lot of songs with Ezra Koenig, some really cool stuff that I hope people get to hear. We wrote a couple of things for another artist that might be huge records for the end of summer-one of them started with a Vampire Weekend idea. But he's not traditional rock-he's like me, a hodgepodge of styles and influences. And I have a studio with [producer] Ariel Rechtshaid, so every day I'm harassing Haim to listen to my beats. But I don't make anything that they ever like [laughs]!"



Elba confirmed for Star Trek Beyond

Idris Elba will appear in 'Star Trek Beyond'. The 42-year-old star - who was rumored to be starring as a villain in the sci-fi sequel - confirmed he will be taking up a role in the movie when he appeared alongside the entire cast, including Chris Pine, Zoe Saldana, Zachary Quinto, Simon Pegg, Karl Urban, Anton Yelchin and John Cho, for an Omaze charity video. Idris joins the group part way through the video and is welcomed by Chris, who says, "Idris, glad you could join us." In the past, Idris has been rumored to be starring as Klingon but co-writer and star Simon Pegg has admitted it is unlikely he would be given that specific role. He said: "Idris, I heard there's a rumor he's been spoken to about stuff, so he may be in the film but he won't be a Klingon." Meanwhile, Simon also admitted that he felt under pressure to write the script for the upcoming movie. He quipped: "It's enormous pressure, I'm barely able to speak right now I'm so terrified, but no it's good, it's going well. "You know we're working at it hard and I'm writing with a guy [Doug Jung], he's in LA I'm here. I was there last week, writing with him, he's going to come here next week and we'll just keep plugging away at it and hopefully come up with something that the fans like, everybody likes, not just the fans."

Cara Delevingne: Accept me as an actress

Cara Delevingne wants everyone to "accept" her as an actress. The 22-year-old model is starring in five movies this year, including 'Pan' and 'Kids In Love', but has insisted she's going to carry on modeling too. Cara said: "I have five movies coming out this year, which is really exciting, so you don't really have a choice but to accept me as an actress now! "I'm going to shove myself down your throat, in the nicest way possible. I'm going to carry on modeling - it's just going to happen a lot less. Actresses do modeling jobs, so it'll be kind of the same thing." The British beauty will next be seen in 'Paper Towns' as Margo, a girl who goes missing, and Cara has revealed she

wanted to play the part as soon as she read it, because she shared so many "similarities" with the character. Speaking to Britain's OK! magazine, Cara said: "When I first read the script I was in awe of (Margo). She popped out of the page at me and we share a couple of similarities. When I first read the script there were lines that I'd actually said to people before, which scared me immensely. "You don't love me, you don't even know me. I've said that a couple of times. It's that idea of people making their own ideas of you. After that I knew I had to try my hardest to get it."



Jake Gyllenhaal: Fear motivated me in 'Southpaw'

Jake Gyllenhaal says fear is a good "motivator". The 34-year-old star has admitted he was terrified ahead of his role as Billy 'The Great' Hope in 'Southpaw' because he didn't want to look like an "idiot" with his limited boxing knowledge. He said: "I spent five months training for the movie and I trained twice a day. I figured I'd make five months into 10 months if I did that. "And I was just basically scared that I'd look like an idiot, so I worked as hard as I could. Fear is sometimes a good motivating thing." And despite his initial nerves, Jake is "very proud" of the final movie. He added to Access Hollywood: "I'm very proud of it. I'm proud of the fact that it's a movie that seems like a boxing film, but really is a family movie about the relationship between a father and a daughter, which moves me so much. "Everybody worked so hard on the movie. And they worked so hard making those relationships real and I think we made a beautiful movie so I'm really proud of it." Meanwhile, the Hollywood hunk previously admitted he felt "naked" whilst filming for the action drama. He shared: "Even when you're only filming a fight, even when it's a movie, in the ring you feel totally naked. "It's a strange thing, 700 extras watching."



Whedon praises 'word perfect' Johansson

Joss Whedon has revealed Scarlett Johansson was "word perfect" in 'Avengers: Age Of Ultron'. The acclaimed director has heaped praise on the Hollywood icon, who starred as Black Widow/Natasha Romanov, and Tom Hiddleston - who played Loki - in the Marvel superhero movie that hit cinema screens earlier this year. He said: "I'm going to have to give it up for Natasha and Loki, just for being a dream

to write, and to two actors for being word perfect and riveting." Joss has already confirmed he will not return to direct another movie in the 'Avengers' series, and he's also revealed he doesn't have any plans to create a director's cut of 'Avengers: Age Of Ultron'. He told Collider: "It has always been my ambition never to do a director's cut of anything, and always to make the movie with the studio that we

both want to make. "Ultron" was very complex. There was a lot of back-and-forth. My instinct is no. Just as an artist, I'm super lazy and that sounds like it would be hard. I don't think there's interest in it, right now."
