KGAC FILES FIVE CASES AGAINST GLOBAL CLEARINGHOUSE SYSTEMS

KUWAIT: The Kuwait General Administration of Customs (KGAC) said yesterday it has lodged five lawsuits against the Global Clearinghouse Systems (GCS), demanding a total of KD 120.7 million (around \$399.8 million).

The KGAC said in a press statement that the dispute erupted with the GCS when it joined bids for the establishment of Salmi and Nuwaiseeb border outlets, and when the KGAC

decided in 2006 to liquidate the KD 10 million letters of warranty submitted by the GCS. This decision, it maintained, prompted the GCS to take legal action against the KGAC and demanded compensations for failure to deliver the land allocated for the border outlets, it said.

On June 15, 2015, a court ordered the KGAC to pay the GCS KD 68 million and seven percent of annual legal interest, the KGAC added. The

KGAC and the GCS challenged the decision, but it was upheld by the court of appeals on September 13, 2015, according to the statement.

It added that it had coordinated with the Cabinet's Fatwa and Legislation Department to take necessary legal procedures to stop the enforcement of the court ruling, noting that it is not an irrevocable decision. —KUNA

KUWAIT: The Indonesian government is considering suspending the export of female domestic laborers to several countries including Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) states from 2017, said informed sources, noting that only those working in professions like nursing, medicine, hotels and tailoring would be allowed to leave. Indonesia had banned domestic workers from going to Kuwait in 2010 citing abuse cases there.

Arm deals

MP Ahmad Al-Qudhaibi yesterday filed a parliamentary inquiry to Deputy Prime Minister and Defense Minister Sheikh Khaled Al-Jarrah Al-Sabah concerning recent arms deals. Qudhaibi inquired about the technical validity of barges and boats bought for the navy, the assessment committees and reports, quotations, purchase contracts and whether the ministry had visited the concerned ship-building companies during the past five years. In addition, Qudhaibi inquired about purchasing 18 Super Hornet fighters and whether the manufacturers intend to suspend the fighter's production and close the factory by 2017.

Zionist crimes

The Kuwait Democratic Forum yesterday urged all states, governments and Arab and international organizations including the UN Security Council and other organizations to condemn the war crimes committed by the Zionist entity and its constant attacks on the Al-Aqsa Mosque compound that has been repeatedly violated by Israeli officials, settlers and troops.

GCC FMS MEET IN RIYADH

RIYADH: The Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) foreign ministers came together here yesterday for their 136th session, with Kuwaiti First Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah attending.

Addressing the session, Qatari Foreign Minister Khalid Al-Attiyah said the meeting came amid exceptional regional and international circumstances, hoping that it would produce outcomes that could fulfill the expectations of the GCC leaders and people.

On the Palestinian situation, Attiyah, who chaired the session, condemned Israeli practices at Al-Aqsa Mosque as "serious and unprecedented steps." He also offered heartfelt condolence to the Saudi government and people over the victims of the recent crane accident at the Holy Mosque in Makkah.

The GCC foreign ministers then had a closed meeting to discuss issues and subjects put on the agenda of their 136th session. The meeting focuses on committee recommendations aiming to further promote and shore up cooperation and integration among the GCC member states.

It also includes subjects to be discussed by the foreign ministers of the GCC countries and other countries and international groups during the next UN General Assembly late in September, together with the latest regional and international developments, mainly Yemen, Syria, Libya, Palestine and anti-terror efforts. —KUNA

HUMAN TRAFFICKER ARRESTED: VISAS SOLD FOR KD 600 EACH

KUWAIT: Residency Affairs Department detectives arrested an Asian man who used to bring Indian workers into Kuwait under the sponsorship of citizens. The suspect completed the transactions in exchange of money that the sponsor would receive as soon as the transaction is completed. The suspect confessed to charging KD 600 for each transaction, adding that the sponsor gets KD 500 while he keeps KD 100 for himself. He said the papers he had with him belonged to citizens, adding that he had already received the money and already gave the sponsors their share.

Forged IDs

Mubarak Al-Kabeer security arrested five Asian nationals, including three men and two women, who were specialized in forging work IDs. Twenty eight violating laborers were also arrested. Police discovered that they were absconding, but carried forged IDs. All suspects were sent to the concerned authorities for questioning.

Suicide

A Nepalese national committed suicide in a building in Mahboubia, according to preliminary investigations. The building's haris (janitor) discovered the death when he forced-opened the apartment's door. The body was recovered by the coroner.

Smuggling foiled

An attempt to smuggle 10 kilograms of marijuana into Kuwait was foiled by customs officers at Kuwait International Airport. The smuggler reportedly used a trick in which he left a bag containing the drugs at the airport, with the intention of coming later to claim it, thinking that the suitcase would not be searched that way. The Asian man had claimed that the bag was lost, but it was later found with the drugs inside. He was sent to the proper authorities for further action.

Liquor factory

A liquor factory was discovered in Riqqa, where eight distillation barrels, 201 drums, 29 sugar sacks, three cartons of yeast, 252 bottles, and six cylinders were found. Police arrested four expatriates inside.

In this article I would like to narrate a story of a domestic worker who came here thinking that gates of heaven would open up for her and ended up in a nightmare. Fatma, which is not her real name, spoke with tears shedding from her eyes every day as she was narrating her story, which started by saying that she had an idea from a friend back in her country that Kuwait is a paradise in terms of living conditions, salaries, treatment and so on. Fatma then decided to sell her small property and some of her cattle and paid a bundle to the agency back then for her dream to come true. She obtained the airline ticket and was promised by the agency that her salary would be nearly 200 Kuwaiti dinars a month. She was so happy that she may pay back what she had sold and compensate. She then arrived to the 'dream country' and as the gates of the airport opened, she was welcomed by the recruiting office representative who promised her that everything was all right. She then reached the office which was crammed by customers who were anxiously awaiting the arrival of the plane from that country. Few minutes later, Fatma's name was called loudly by the office's secretary. Fatma replies: Yes madam. The madam answers: Get ready to go with this family to work in the house. Fatma got shocked when she heard that and replied by saying she was promised to work outside not in a house and was also promised high salary. "We cannot do anything about it," the secretary replied. Fatma starts screaming and yelling, wanting to go home and suddenly was forced by a number of helpers, who carried her to the new sponsor's car, and she was locked up inside. She arrives in the house and sits still doing nothing but crying and crying, but that did not help. She waited till the next morning and was taken back to the office for refusing to work. Fatma ended up going from house to house to up to 15 houses while insisting not to work. She thought of an evil idea to come out of this dilemma by escaping from the last house. She packed her bags and sneaked out from the house to the street at dawn and fortunately a taxi was passing by, who took her to the unknown destination. It is the hell of Jleeb Al-Suhyoukh, where she was locked up behind prison-like fortified steal gates. She was forced to practice prostitution until she was caught by police along with others. Fatma ended up going to the deportation center and remained there for almost a month before she was deported. Her dream vanished at the moment she entered Kuwait. Now, the question arises, who is to blame? Do we blame the recruitment agency back in her country or the agency here which did not adhere to the contract? Have patience Fatma, and you will regain your right before Almighty Allah in Judgment Day.
