SMOKE COMES OUT OF EMPTY APARTMENT

KUWAIT: Smoke was coming out of a closed apartment in Jabriya, whose residents are out of Kuwait, so citizens called the police, who called the fire department. They then went to the apartment with a warrant to break down the door. The smoke was due to faulty wiring. Power was cut off and the owner, who is in Europe, was informed.

Family dispute

A female citizen walked into Reqqa police station with a medical report and told them she was visiting her sister with her young son to discuss certain family problems, but her half-sister and her daughters beat her. A complaint was lodged against the sister and her husband, who threatened to harm his sister-in-law. Police are investigating.

Man assaulted

An Indian man was forced to sign papers at knifepoint. He told Salmiya police that an unidentified person stormed his apartment with a knife and forced him to sign documents he could not read because they were in Arabic. The suspect then ran away. A complaint was lodged, while the Indian is waiting to find out what he signed.

Officer insulted

A Syrian man did not like that an employee at the commerce ministry told him that his transaction does not meet the requirements, and insulted the employee. He was taken to Fahaeel police station. The Kuwaiti employee, who did not know the details of the suspect, went to the police station and lodged a complaint, but the company details led to identifying him, so he was summoned and detained.

Cross-dressers caught

Police arrested three cross-dressers with women's clothes and illicit pills. They were sent to the Drugs Control General Department. Special missions patrols asked a car to stop, but the driver attempted to escape, so they asked for backup and the road was closed, so the three got out and started running, but they were chased and caught. They were found to be a bedoon and Iranians. When the car was searched, 180 tablets were found in addition to a bag full of cosmetics. They were sent to concerned authorities.

ACs stolen

Jahra detectives are looking for unidentified persons who stole central air conditioning units at Jahra labor department, making employees work in extreme heat. A security source said when employees felt the heat, they called technicians, only to find the units were stolen. — Al-Rai
